I am requesting funding for UNLV Quantum Science Infrastructure in Fiscal Year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, located at 4505 S. Maryland Parkway, Las Vegas, Nevada 89154.

The funding will be used to support the acquisition and fabrication of state-of-the-art equipment to establish a robust infrastructure foundation for Quantum Science and Technology (QST) research at UNLV, addressing critical gaps in campus capabilities..

The project is a responsible use of taxpayer funds because, by establishing a regional hub for hybrid quantum information research, this initiative will create high-skill research, engineering, and technical positions while strengthening undergraduate, graduate, and workforce training pathways across Clark County. These efforts will help diversify the regional economy beyond tourism, position Southern Nevada within the national quantum technology ecosystem, and generate sustained statewide benefits through job creation, talent retention, and long-term innovation capacity.
